So, for example, if a proposed part-time core team member for the ESS is committed to working on another part-time project during the same time period, this is acceptable as long as his/her availability does not conflict with their proposed role and work-load for the ESS. Indeed, in the (unlikely) situation that a proposed full-time core team member is also committed to another contract under which they have to work one day a week at the weekend, this would also be acceptable as they still would be available to work full time on the ESS and their availability for both contracts does not conflict. In answer to point 1 of the question: in light of the above, the clause will not be a transition phase. However, it should be noted that some flexibility has been provided in the TOR by allowing candidates to propose one of the full time Core team experts as two Part time experts (see response n 3 ).
