Could you confirm if the goal of the study is to assess the feasibility of a technical solution whereby an access seeker present in one given country (e.g. France) could provide services based on VULA in all EU countries? Or, is it understood that for an access seeker to provide services based on VULA in all EU countries, the access seeker will have to purchase VULA and get interconnected locally in each of the EU countries?	The tender specifications for the study 'Investigation into access and interoperability standards for the promotion of the internal market for electronic communications networks and services' (SMART 2014/0023) specifies as its objective 'to support the Commission's policy development efforts towards the building of a truly single market for electronic communications through a thorough techno-economic assessment of the technical specifications and related standards supporting the provisions of virtual access products in Europe as well as an assessment of the conditions required for ensuring technical harmonisation and related network and service interoperability in the EU'. When the tender specifications refer to 'cross-border service provision' (in section 1 regarding the context) or 'cross-border' environment (in section 2 regarding tasks), they refer to the provision of electronic communications retail services (for both residential and business markets) by one operator in more than one Member State on the basis of own network assets and/or harmonised wholesale access products.
