Question: + Will it be possible/requested to use those models in the project related to his Tender? + What may be the additional functionalities to be developed or build on the aforementioned models?	<b>07/03/2019</b> The tenderer should describe in their offer the approach, method and analytical tools they intend to use to address the tasks set out in the technical specifications. There is no obligation to use a specific model. The evaluation of the tender offers will assess which tenderer understood the tasks best and provided the best analytical tools to address them, in particular for modelling. The modelling approach should be based on analytical tools, in particular energy system models, for which the tenderer is able to prove a well-exercised ability of application based on expertise and experience.

3	06/03/2019 15:46	19/03/2019 16:08	Evidence A1 period clarification	<p>In the Tender Specifications document section 4.2.4a in page 18, the following is written: "The project references indicated below consist in a list of relevant services provided in the past three years, with the sums, dates and clients, public or private, accompanied by statements issued by the clients." While in Criterion A1 evidence is written: "the tenderer must provide references for 5 projects delivered in these fields in the last five years with a minimum value for each project of €120.000". Therefore, we would like to clarify if the 5 project references withing criterion A1 should be delivered in the last 3 or 5 years.</p>	<p><b>19/03/2019</b> For Criterion A1 the requirement set out in Evidence A1 applies. Accordingly, the last 5 years is the period within which the evidence listed in A1 should be provided as a minimum. That means that the tenderer must provide evidences for five projects delivered in the last five years with a minimum value of 120.000 EUR for each project. These projects must relate to the fields listed under Criterion A1. The chapeau of section 4.2.4 is corrected to read as follows: Tenderers (in case of a joint tender the combined capacity of all members of the group and identified subcontractors) must comply with the criteria listed below. The project references indicated below consist in a list of relevant services provided during the requested time period, with the sums, dates and clients, public or private, accompanied by statements issued by the clients.</p>

Shall we provide a certificate of satisfactory execution for all projects, also those where the contracting authority was the European Commission itself?	<b>04/04/2019</b> The same projects can be used to cover both criterion A1 and A2, provided that these projects are capable of providing evidence for both the required experience in the fields specified under A1 and the required capacity to work in EU official languages including at least English. Providing a certificate of satisfactory execution of projects relevant to criteria A1 and A2 would be an advantage; it is however not a mandatory element of the evidence.
