To our knowledge, also the EC itself has not had procurement on housing policy with that scope for years, and we do not believe any organization would be able to meet this criteria. | Thank you for your question. Tenderers are requested to submit examples of past projects in the field of homelessness, or in the field of housing exclusion. Housing exclusion is a broad policy field, with close links to many other social policy areas (poverty, social protection, social inclusion, anti-discrimination). The size of the project required as an example is smaller than the actual tender, to allow for as open and as wide competition as possible, while keeping in with the policy field and scope relevant for the work that is to be commissioned. |
