There is almost no Plone company in Europe that can fulfill the requirement of 35 developers. So the call for tender excludes most of the Plone companies that have the knowledge for building and maintaining large Plone projects. Can you clarify the huge hurdles for Plone companies?</p>	<p>15/12/2020 As specified in the Tender specifications in section 1.2. Subject of the contract, the services to be provided are not limited to Plone-related development. The IT services and support shall be in the following areas: • Web development with Python, Zope and Plone; Node.js, React and Elasticsearch; • DevOps operations with Jenkins, Docker; • Availability of 1st and 2nd level helpdesk support services of said web development. Note the list of technologies listed in section 1.3.2. In addition, the number of Senior Plone developers required is in fact minimum 5, with a minimum of 3 years' relevant professional experience in Plone for each CV. The other minimum 20 Senior consultants should have a minimum of 3 years' relevant professional experience (full time), covering collectively all the areas listed under section 1.3.2., meaning it is sufficient that one consultant out of the 20 has some experience in Plone for the "collectively criteria" to be fulfilled. The minimum 20 CVs mentioned above represent the competences the contracting authorities seek for web developer profile. We refer you to the footnote no 4 for the list of eligible countries. The above requirements do not apply to subcontractors. Examples of tasks for the Managerial staff: discuss how to organise communication across all projects and developers; decide the division of the developers across teams and projects; decide when to include extra resources during peak periods to some of the development teams; discuss how to resolve prioritisation conflicts when there are multiple projects asking for the same developers; resource re-balancing, e.g. when a large project ends, discuss how to redistribute the developers that are freed up to other teams that have the need for more developers; escalation when teams do not meet quality requirements.

Technical and professional capacity, point 2; the economic operator to which the contract is awarded, including contact details for potential check; percentage of total value of the contract subcontracted to the tenderer; description of the services performed by the subcontractor under the contract.

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
