Economic operators wishing to attend should have communicated the names and positions of those attending 5 working days before the visit - by e-mail to the following address: Equilog-Contract-Finance@europarl.europa.eu. A maximum of 2 representatives per economic operator may attend. Hence, the deadline to confirm the interest to participate has expired on 04/01/2022. Attendance at this visit by at least one representative per economic operator is compulsory; any operator failing to be represented will be excluded.
