## Invitation to Tender No. EMSA/OP/9/2018

(Open Procedure)

General Communication and Publication services [Lot 1, Lot 2, Lot 3, Lot 4 and Lot 5]

Dear Sir/Madam,

1. The European Maritime Safety Agency (EMSA) is planning to award the public contract referred to above. The procurement documents consist of this Invitation, the Tender specifications with its appendix(s), and the draft contract.
2. Tenderers who wish to submit an offer are invited to send to EMSA a bid duly signed by their authorised representative, together with three copies of the bid (in total: one original and three copies). The bid shall be submitted in paper AND electronic versions on CD, DVD or USB key or similar added to the paper bid. In case of any inconsistency, the paper version will have precedence over the electronic one. Bids can be submitted in three different ways:

**(a) by post**

The bid should be posted no later than 14/05/2018, with the stamp of the post office acting as proof. Please note, if the bid is submitted by post it is recommended that it is sent by registered post.

**(b) by hand-delivery**

The hand delivery should be made no later than 20.00 (Lisbon local time) on 14/05/2018.

A dated and signed receipt or a registration number **has to be requested by the person delivering the bid as proof of delivery.**

**(c) by private courier service**

The bid should be 'deposited' with the private courier service no later than 14/05/2018, with the slip issued by the private courier service acting as proof.

**In whichever way the bid is submitted, the following address shall be used:**

3. Bids must be submitted in two envelopes, one inside the other and both envelopes should be sealed. The inner envelope must be marked as follows:

The outer envelope must be marked as follows:

If self-sealed envelopes are used, they must be closed with adhesive tape with the sender's signature written across it.

4. Tenders must be signed by a duly authorised representative of the tenderer and perfectly legible so that there can be no doubt as to the words and figures therein contained.
5. The period of validity of the tender, during which tenderers may not modify the terms of their tenders in any respect shall be until 31/12/2018.
6. The tenders received will be opened at 10.00 hrs (Lisbon time) on 18/05/2018, in the offices of the European Maritime Safety Agency, Praça Europa 4, 1249-206 Lisboa, Portugal.

This opening session will be public and a representative of each tenderer may attend the opening of the tenders. At the end of the opening session, the Chairperson of the Opening Committee will indicate the name of the tenderers and the decision concerning the admissibility of each offer received. The prices indicated in each received tender will not be communicated. Should you wish to attend, please send a request (at least five calendar days before the date of the opening) to the following e-mail address: open092018@ems.a.europa.eu indicating the name of the attending person and the tenderer they represent.

7. Submission of a tender implies acceptance of all the terms and conditions set out in the procurement documents and, where appropriate, the waiver of the tenderer's own general or specific terms and conditions. These requirements are binding on the tenderer to whom the contract is awarded for the duration of the contract.
8. All costs incurred during the preparation and submissions of tenders are to be borne by the tenderers and will not be reimbursed.

9. The Tender Specifications, listing all the documents that must be produced in order to tender, including supporting evidence of economic, financial, technical and professional capacity and the draft contract are available under the dedicated section of the procurement procedure on the e-Tendering platform at <http://simap.ted.europa.eu/>.
10. Contact between EMSA and the tenderers is prohibited throughout the procedure, save in exceptional circumstances and under the following conditions only:

**(a) Before the final date for submission of tenders:**

- (i) At the request of the tenderer, EMSA may provide additional information solely for the purpose of clarifying the procurement documents.

Any requests for additional information must be made in writing and sent through the e-Tendering platform at <http://simap.ted.europa.eu/>, dedicated section of the respective procurement procedure.

EMSA is not bound to reply to requests for additional information made less than six working days before the deadline for submission of tenders.

- (ii) EMSA may, on its own initiative, inform interested parties of any error, inaccuracy, omission or any other clerical error in the procurement documents.
- (iii) Any additional information, including that referred to above, will be published on the dedicated section of the procurement procedure on the e-Tendering platform at <http://simap.ted.europa.eu/>. The respective section on the website will be updated regularly and it is the tenderers' responsibility to check for updates and modifications during the tendering period.

**(b) After the opening of tenders:**

- (i) If clarification is required or if obvious clerical errors in the tender need to be corrected, EMSA may contact the tenderer provided the terms of the tender are not modified as a result.

11. Public Procurement rules applying to calls for tender launched by EMSA are contained in the EMSA Financial Regulation available under the Financial Regulations section on EMSA's website ([www.emsa.europa.eu](http://www.emsa.europa.eu))
12. This invitation to tender is in no way binding on EMSA. EMSA's contractual obligation commences only upon signature of the contract with the successful tenderer.
13. Up to the point of signature, EMSA may either abandon the procurement or cancel the award procedure, without the candidates or tenderers being entitled to claim any compensation. This decision must be substantiated and the candidates or tenderers notified.
14. Once EMSA has opened the tender, the document shall become the property of EMSA and it shall be treated confidentially.

15. Tenderers will be informed of the outcome of this procurement procedure by email. It is the tenderers' responsibility to provide a valid e-mail address together with their contact details in their tender offer and to check this e-mail address regularly.
16. If processing a reply to the invitation to tender involves the recording and processing of personal data (such as name, address and CV), the data will be processed in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council<sup>1</sup>. Unless indicated otherwise, the replies to tenderers, and any personal data requested, shall be used to evaluate the tender in accordance with the specifications of the invitation to tender and will be processed solely for that purpose by the Head of The Executive Office.
17. Details concerning the processing of personal data are contained in the privacy statement "Information on personal data protection in procurement procedures" available at: <http://www.emsa.europa.eu/about/personal-data-protection.html>
18. Personal data may be registered in the Early Detection and Exclusion System (EDES) if a tenderer is deemed to be in one of the situations detailed in Article 106 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012 of the European Parliament and of the Council<sup>2</sup>. 19. In addition to economic operators established in the Member States of the Union, only economic operators from the following countries are eligible to participate in the present procurement procedure: Albania, FYROM, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Montenegro, Norway, Serbia and Bosnia and Herzegovina.
20. For British tenderers - please be aware that after the UK's withdrawal from the EU, the rules of access to EU procurement procedures of economic operators established in third countries will apply to candidates or tenderers from the UK depending on the outcome of the negotiations. In case such access is not provided by legal provisions in force candidates or tenderers from the UK could be rejected from the procurement procedure.
